Giving in the Old Testament:

- 1) "Tithe"—1/10 of one's property or produce given to the Lord to support His work
- 2) First tither—Abraham (Gen. 14:18-20)
- 3) Principle of firstfruits (Exodus 23:16, 19; 34:22-26)
- 4) Three tithes
 - a) First tithe—given to Levites (Lev. 27:30-33; Num. 18:21-32), who tithed 10% of that to the priests
 - b) Second tithe—from the remaining 9/10, set apart and consumed in Jerusalem (unless you lived far away) (Deut. 14:22-27)
 - c) Third tithe, or "poor tithe"—given every three years to the Levites and the poor (Deut. 14:28-29)
- 5) Meaning of the tithe:
 - a) Acknowledgement of God's ownership of everything (Ps. 24:1; Mal. 3:8, 10)
 - b) An expression of thanks to God for His generosity (Gen. 28:20-22)
 - c) Participation in God's activity in the world (support for Levites and priests and food for the poor)

- 1) "Tithe"—1/10 of one's property or produce given to the Lord to support His work

- 4) Three tithes
 - a) First tithe—given to Levites (Lev. 27:30-33; Num. 18:21-32), who tithed 10% of that to the priests
